As part of the club's "**Sky Blue**" initiative to reduce waste, the club is attempting to move as many operations as possible to this vehicle. As such, members are asked to consult the website for various league information and news, and to use the website to answer questions and concerns.

As much as possible, club communication will be via the website or email. Additionally follow our Facebook and Instagram accounts or our Twitter for occasional announcements as well.

Club Activities

St. Vital Annual Meeting

In May, the St. Vital Curling Club Constitution dictates a membership meeting to discuss club operations and elect new board members for the following season. Date and time are available on the website. All members are encouraged to attend and air their views. Reminder invitations via e-mail.

In early summer, the Past Presidents host a golf tournament. A limited number (first come, first served). Open to all members. Reminder invitations via e-mail.

St. Vital Semi-Annual Meeting and Membership Night

In September, the St. Vital Curling Club Constitution dictates a membership meeting to discuss the upcoming season's operations, and to solicit membership dues. Date and time available on the website. Reminder invitations via e-mail.

Buffet Evenings

Our food services host a buffet experience once a month during the curling season. Serving excellent food, buffet style, with a limit to available seating. Tickets required, from food services or at the bar. Notices posted throughout the club.

Past President's New Years Open House

The Past Presidents of St. Vital Curling Club host an Open House on New Year's Day between 11:00 am and 2:00 pm. Club members are invited to enjoy an afternoon of free food and refreshment and take in the annual "President vs Ice Maker" bank board challenge. Reminder invitations issued via e-mail.

Manitoba Open Calcutta

- c. To WAIVE any and all claims that I may have now or in the future against St. Vital Curling Club;
- d. To freely ACCEPT AND FULLY ASSUME all such risks and possibility of personal injury, death, property damage, expense and related loss, including loss of income, resulting from my participation in the activities, events and programs of the St. Vital Curling Club.

To FOREVER RELEASE St. Vital Curling Club from any and all liability for any and all claims, demands, actions, damages (including direct, indirect, special and/or consequential), losses, actions, judgments, and costs (including legal fees) (collectively, the "Claims") which I have or may have in the future, that might arise out of, result from, or relate to my participation in the Activities, even though such Claims may have been caused by any manner whatsoever, including but not limited to, the negligence, gross negligence, negligent rescue, omissions, carelessness, breach of contract and/or breach of any statutory duty of care of St. Vital Curling Club.

I expressly agree that this Agreement is intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by the law and that if any of its provisions are held to be invalid, the balance shall, notwithstanding, continue in full legal force and effect.

I acknowledge that I have read this Agreement and understand it, that I have executed this Agreement voluntarily, and that this Agreement is to be binding upon myself, my heirs, spouse, children, parents, guardians, next of kin, executors, administrators and legal or personal representatives

Personal Information Clause

All personal information collected by St. Vital Curling Club shall be held in strict confidence, and shall only be used by St. Vital Curling Club for communication purposes with the members of this league, except;

- a) registration of St. Vital Curling Club members to the governing bodies of curling in this Province.
- b) the team Contact Phone Number, which may be distributed by St. Vital Curling Club for team communication in the posting of league schedules.

Lockers

Members League teams are allowed the use of one locker in the locker room, located in the basement, for the year. Teams are asked to supply their own lock, and keep their locker locked, to ensure continued assignment.

Locker room access is available from the front door, from the ice surface (west end), and via the back stairs. St. Vital Curling Club would appreciate if all curlers, ***once wearing their curling shoes, please exit directly to the ice***, to avoid carrying dirt from the staircase onto the ice.

Access code

Please ask for the locker room access code. This code is to prevent unwarranted access and should not be disclosed except to teammates.

Locker assignment - returning teams (Men's Locker Room)

A list of last year's locker claimants is posted on the bulletin board at the far end of the locker room. If you wish to retain your locker from before, please write your name beside your desired locker number (over the old listing) as soon as you reclaim. This allows us to find unused lockers for new members.

Locker assignment - new teams (Men's Locker Room)

If a locker is not already designated on the list, you may claim it for use for the year. If there are no unclaimed lockers, please contact **Ice & Draw** to find an open locker for your use.

Locker Availability in the Ladies Locker Room

Any open lockers are available to members for the entire season

League Play

The St. Vital Curling Club expects that members will abide by the stated rules in good faith.

Team play

The 5-rock rule is in effect. All games are 8 ends, or to a bell time of 1 hour and 45 minutes. At the bell, the end in progress, and one more, if needed, may be played. An end is considered finished when the final rock of the end has crossed the 1st t-line.

Doubles

All games are 8 ends, or to a bell time of 1 hour and 25 minutes. At the bell, the end in progress, and one more, if needed, may be played. An end is considered finished when the final rock of the end has crossed the 1st t-line.

Starting times

Teams are asked to be ready to play at the starting bell. Any team causing a delay of 10 minutes or more will be penalized 1 point for every ten minutes late, (and one end will be considered played,) up to a total of 3 points, after which the game is considered forfeit. The team causing the delay must throw first, upon start of play.

Ties after regulation

Ties at the end of regulation must be resolved by skip's rocks. The team to score last throws first. Any member of a team may throw. Sweeping is allowed by the throwing team only.

Extra players & spares

A 5th player (team play) may play any position on the team. A spare, or replacement player, must play lead or if 2 spares are required, they must play lead and second. A team unable to field 2 or more listed players must forfeit their game. A team may play a game with only 3 players, with the lead throwing 3 rocks and the third throwing 3 rocks.

A 3rd player (doubles) may play any position on the team. Any team unable to field a listed player must forfeit their game

Member Leagues

Open Leagues

The St. Vital Curling Club Open Leagues play on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. Draw times are early only on Monday and alternate (early/late) on Wednesday and Thursday. Teams play a total of 20 games throughout the season. Monday hosts a maximum of 12 teams whereas Wednesday and Thursday host a maximum of 24 teams.

Teams begin play seeded into 4, 3 or 2 groups (based on the number of teams in the league) with new teams seeded at the bottom, unless they provide prior experience in which case, they may be seeded higher. There are 4 rounds of 5 games for each team. After each round, team points will be aggregated, and the teams will be realigned.

Ladies League

The St. Vital Curling Club Ladies League plays on Tuesday. Draw times are either early or late (non-alternating). Teams play a total of 20 games throughout the season. Each draw time (early/late) hosts a maximum of 12 teams.

For each of the two draw times (early/late) teams begin play seeded into 2 groups with new teams seeded at the bottom, unless they provide prior experience in which case, they may be seeded higher. There are 4 rounds of 5 games for each team. After each round, team points will be aggregated, and the teams will be realigned.

Doubles League

The St. Vital Curling Club Doubles League plays on Monday. Draw times are late only. Teams play a total of 20 games during the course of a season. The Doubles League hosts a maximum of 12 teams. After each round, team points will be aggregated, and the teams will be realigned.

League Scheduling

League points

Teams in Group A are awarded 13 points for a win and 4 points for a loss. Each subsequent group is awarded one point less. Teams that are not fully paid will not be awarded any points.

Weighted points

When comparing teams between leagues, teams from smaller leagues will have their final point total weighted against a “base” if the largest league.

$$\text{TBase} = \# \text{ Teams}; \text{GBase} = \# \text{ Groups} \\ 1 - (((\text{TBase} - \# \text{Tm}) / \text{GBase}) / \text{TBase})$$

League results

Teams are asked to record wins as soon as they finish their game on the mark up sheets provided. Mark a “W” for a win and an “L” for a loss across from your team’s name, under the name of the team defeated. If the game is a “cross group” game, mark the results in the box at the end of the group.

If a team does not record a result by the end of a round, they will not be awarded any points. A loss is worth more than no record.

League Draws

Member league draws are posted on the main bulletin board next to the entrance on the main floor. Draws are also posted on the St. Vital Curling Club website (www.stvitalcurling.ca). Teams are asked to consult the website for any changes to draw times; posted at least 3 days before the start of the round.

Contact information for each team is provided with the draws. Should a team be unable to play a game, they are asked to inform their opponent at the earliest possible time.

Any makeup games must be played before the final draw of a round, or result in a forfeit to the non-offending team. Possible makeup game times should be coordinated with Ice Rentals as to available sheets of ice.

Round changes

After each round, team points are assessed and teams are realigned to reflect their current status within the league. After each round a group winner and group loser is determined. The group winner must advance at least one group, while the group loser must drop one group. A team cannot move up more than one group in a round, unless they are undefeated and the points allow in which case, they may move up two groups. A team cannot drop more than one group.

After each round, team points are assessed, and teams are realigned to reflect their current status within the league. Each round decides a Group winner, and a Group loser. The Group winner must advance one group (but never more than two groups), while the Group loser must drop one group.

The winner in each group of each round is awarded “**St. Vital Bar Bucks**”, for food or refreshment in the club.

Playoffs

Group playoffs

Group playoff spots will be awarded to the top team from each group in round 1 through 4 in the Open Members’ Leagues and the Ladies League with the following caveats:

- in a 3-group league, A group and B group spots will be assigned to their respective group playoffs; the top 2 C group spot holders (based on points) will be assigned to C group and the other 2 teams will be assigned to D group.
- In a 2-group league, the 2 A group spot holders (based on points) will be assigned to A group and the remaining 2 teams will be assigned to B group. The top 2 B group spot holders (based on points) will be assigned to C group and the remaining 2 teams will be assigned to D group.

A team may only hold a group playoff spot for the highest group in which they qualify. Vacated spots are awarded to the next highest team in the group of the vacated round. Teams playing on different nights are considered separate teams and may hold different group playoff spots.

Each group playoff consists of a **single knockout**, with bye games awarded to teams with the highest aggregate points.

Consolation playoff

Any team may enter the Consolation if they do not have another playoff spot. The Consolation is limited to **16 teams playing a single knockout**.

Doubles league playoffs

Doubles playoff spots will be awarded to the top 6 teams based on weighted points at the end of the season. Playoffs consists of a **single knockout**, with bye games awarded to teams with the highest aggregate points.

Open club championships

The open club championship consists of 8 teams seeded into two single knockout events. The winner of each side plays in a final to be declared the club champion.

Spots are awarded to the top points team from each of the Open Leagues (Monday, Wednesday and Thursday), plus one spot is reserved for the current club champion provided that at least 3 team members return and that they have not qualified for a spot. The remaining spots are wildcards from the remaining highest weighted point teams league wide. Teams playing in different nights may hold different club championship playoff spots; they are considered separate teams.

Ladies club championships

The Ladies League club championship consists of 6 teams, seeded into two single knockout events. The winner of each side plays a final.

Reserved spots are awarded to the top points team from both the Tuesday Night Ladies Leagues, plus one spot is reserved for the current Ladies Club Champions (returns with 3 members) provided that they have not qualified for a spot. The remaining wildcard spots are the remaining highest weighted point ladies' teams from either Ladies League or Open Leagues.

Extra players & spares

All playoff games require a team to field 3 or more listed players. Any spares must be a registered club member, not involved in the current playoff and must play lead.

No spares are permitted for Doubles League playoff games.

Awards

Aggregate champion

The Aggregate champion is awarded to the team with the most wins in regulation play. Should there be a tie for most wins, a single game playoff will be held.

Ladies League champion

The Ladies League champion is awarded to the team with the most points at the end of regular season play. Should there be a tie, a playoff will be held.

Playoff winners

All playoff winners are awarded a trophy, plus "St. Vital Bar Buck" remuneration. ***Winners must attend the "Awards Banquet" (held in April) to receive their award.***

The Club Champion will become our Men's representative in the Curling Club Championships

The Ladies Club Champion will become our Women's representative in the Curling Club Championships

Should Curl Manitoba allow more than 1 representative the second representative will be the team that lost the Championship Game to the winning Club Champion

(if eligible*, for the following season)

*The team retains this distinction provided they return with 3 members. Otherwise, the representative will be passed to the most qualified runner-up.

Other Club Leagues

St. Vital Curling Club hosts a number of “rental” leagues, many as St. Vital Curling Club affiliates.

St. Vital Juniors Program

The Juniors Program runs on Saturday and Sunday, with age appropriate leagues from very young up to competitive curlers. The program has developed several provincial and national champions.

St. Vital Friday Mixed League

The Friday Mixed League hosts a 24 team evening draw.

St. Vital Seniors Leagues; Stick League; Daytime Ladies Leagues; Daytime Leagues

There are several morning and afternoon leagues, made up of men’s and ladies leagues, plus a Wednesday stick league.

Contract Renters Leagues

Several organizations rent ice time for late afternoon or weekend leagues.

Ice Rental

Occasional ice may be reserved for practice (members may practice for free, if there is an open sheet available) Visit our website for the link to the online Ice Rental Portal. As well, a member may ask to rent ice for a business or family function at a nominal cost, depending on the date and time requested. Ice rental inquiries must be made through the **Ice Rental** board member (contact information on website or available from the ice maker). *Prior to the date of the first league game of the season ice rental fee is charged to everyone.*

2) Members (excerpt from the St. Vital Curling Club Constitution)

2.01 Membership - The membership in the Corporation in any one-year period from October 1 to September 30 shall consist of the following:

- a) **Active Members** of the St. Vital Member's Curling Club League who have paid such annual dues as may be prescribed from time to time by the board in regulation to regular curlers on a curling team for the curling season falling within the particular one year period.
- b) **Associate Members** of the St. Vital Member's Curling League who have paid such annual dues as may be prescribed from time to time by the board in relation to associate curlers or spares who are not assigned as regular curlers on a specific curling team for the curling season falling within the particular one year period.
- c) **Honourary Life Members** as appointed from time to time by the board. Such members shall not be required to pay dues and shall be

entitled to only one vote whether or not they exercise any rights as Active Members or Associate Members.

- d) **Past Presidents** who are not Active Members, Associate Members or Honourary Life Members.
- e) **Clubhouse Members** who have paid such annual dues as may be prescribed from time to time by the board.

2.02 Withdrawal from Membership – Any member wishing to withdraw from membership in the Corporation may do so upon notice in writing to the Secretary of the Corporation.

2.03 Expulsion of Members – the directors may, for good and sufficient cause, request a member to resign, and if he consents the proportion of the year's dues shall be returned, but if he/she does not resign within fourteen days of such request, the directors may, by resolution, suspend or expel the

offending member. The offending member shall have the right to appeal against the decision of the directors, to a meeting of the members and if, at such meeting, by secret ballot, a simple majority of the members present shall vote to reverse the decision of the directors the expulsion or suspension of the member shall be reversed and the member reinstated.

2.04 All members of the Corporation shall have the right and privilege of attending all meetings of the Corporation: to hold office in the Corporation and generally all other rights and privileges usually accorded members of such Corporation.

2.05 The interest of a member of the Corporation shall not be transferable and shall lapse and cease to exist upon death or when a member ceases to be a member of the Corporation by resignation or otherwise howsoever, in accordance with the bylaws from time to time in force.

St. Vital Curling Club House Rules

The Executive, shall have charge of the management of the Club. Members shall not fault with or directly reprimand the employees of the Club; cases of complaint shall be reported to an Executive member.

1. The Club shall be closed at 1:00 am, except on special occasions, the closing time shall be 1:30 am. No member shall be permitted to enter or to remain in the club after these hours unless granted special permission by House Chairman or the President. Members are requested to observe these rules and obey their intent.
2. No gambling shall be permitted within the Club premises.
3. Any member found guilty of conduct detrimental to the best interests of the Club may, at the discretion of the Executive, be reprimanded or removed from the Club.
4. Liquor will be served in strict accordance with Manitoba liquor regulations. No member or guest shall be allowed to bring liquor into the premises under any circumstances.
5. Any member or guest will be refused service if it is thought that they are becoming intoxicated or too boisterous.
6. Minors will not be served. If there is any question as to the age of a member or guest, they will be required to produce evidence of age before being served. Proof of age accepted is a birth certificate or a Liquor Control Commission proof of age identification card
7. Only one bottle of beer, one bottle of wine, or two glasses of liquor shall be served to a person at one time, and no further service of liquor shall be made until all liquor before the customer has been consumed.
8. On ice liquor is available and may only be consumed at the home end of the ice barn. Liquor that is purchased in the lounge may be brought directly to ice level via the east stairwell. Only plastic containers are allowed.
9. The Club shall adhere to all sections of the Liquor Control Act. Hours of operations in the lounge shall be posted by the bar manager as deemed appropriate.

St. Vital Club History

The St. Vital Curling Club was founded in 1933, and the first rocks, borrowed, were thrown in December 1933, in a building owned by the St. Vital Agricultural Society. The building was used in summer months for agricultural fairs, displays, horse shows and animal exhibits.

The newly formed St. Vital Curling Club arranged to rent the premises during winter months, which allowed three sheets of ice. As the curling club grew, a lean-to addition was added in the 1940's to house an additional sheet of ice. In 1950, the St. Vital Curling Club purchased the building, and added another lean-to, which allowed for six sheets of ice.

In 1954, a large super-market chain purchased the land from the city, and the club was moved to its present location on Regal, with full title to the land. A new clubhouse was added.

In 1958, through fundraising that included an airplane as the prize, complete with flying lessons, artificial ice was added.

In 1965, again through fundraising, this time with an automobile as the prize, the current pillar free barn was constructed. Finally, in 1972, a second story was added to the club house, with bar facilities and dance floor.

Along with continual improvements, our latest upgrade has been the purchase of new curling rocks in 2012, and an update to the club's interior to reflect the club colours of blue and gold.

To celebrate St. Vital Curling Club members, team Jennifer Jones, who won the Women's Gold medal in the 2014 Winter Olympics in Sochi, Russia, the club commissioned a mural depicting the ladies' accomplishment on our southern outer wall. As well, the city designated Regal Avenue with the honorary title of "Team Jones Way".

In 2018, Kaitlyn Lawes, with partner John Morris, became the first Gold Medal winners in the inaugural Olympic Mixed Doubles event, during the Winter Olympics held in Pyeong Chang, South Korea. The club commissioned a second mural on the west outer wall.
